The German experts diagnosed what parts had to be replace but the parts need to be made yet so Viking Star would not be leaving Tallin anytime soon.

Viking Cruises gave us the choice to fly home early from Tallin or fly aboard a Charter jet to Bergen, Norway and stay in a hotel for four nights. Everything would be paid for by Viking including food and excursions, as well as accommodations. To Jo and I, this was a "no brainer" and we chose to fly to Bergen, Norway.

While in Norway we travelled by coach bus with a guide to the fiords area of Flam. Not only did we see the fiords, mountains and waterfalls of this area, but traveled on a ferry and later a train into the mountains where snow was still present on the peaks.

In Bergen we traveled up a mountain on the funicular to see views of the port and waterways. The town itself is very picturesque with its bright painted buildings attached to each other like Amsterdam.

We had such a wonderful trip; the "icing on the cake" was Viking Cruises gave us back 50% of the cost of the trip and also a 50% credit toward another Viking Cruise. Talk about damage control. That was unexpected.

I am looking forward to my next Viking Cruise, hopefully to the Mediterranean.
